Studio-Wide Policy for Dress Code

(refer to individual class genres below for exceptions to this policy)

- Our studio prides itself in both modesty and creativity. We want our students to be free to choose their colors, styles and patterns of dancewear.
- Dancers should wear fitted clothing that gives freedom of movement. Some examples include leotards, unitards, biker shorts, leggings, stirrup or convertible tights.
- Dancers will not be allowed to wear cover-ups (t-shirts, sweatpants, etc) over their fitted dance clothing. Exceptions for hip-hop classes only (see below).
- We **do not** allow midriffs to show. Dancers **should not** arrive to any class in only a sports bra and dance shorts.
- Hair is to be pulled back and secured away from the students face.
- No jewelry with the exception of stud earrings.
- Refer to each class genre below for proper dance footwear. Dance shoes are not to be worn outside.
- All shoes, dancewear, and bags should be labeled with the child's name.

<u>Acro</u>

Acro students must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Students must be barefoot and any tights must have a footless option.

Ballet (levels 1, 2A, 3A, 4A)

Dancers must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Canvas or leather ballet shoes are required and may be either full sole or split sole.

Ballet (levels 2B, 3B, 4B)

Dancers must wear a leotard, flesh-toned tights, and flesh-toned ballet shoes. Hair should be secured into a bun. A link will be provided for flesh-toned tights and ballet shoes. Dancers must purchase from this link.

Contemporary (level 3)

Dancers must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Dancers must wear half-sole dance shoes as footwear.

Contemporary (level 4)

Dancers must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Dancers must be barefoot.

Creative Movement

Dancers must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Dancers must be barefoot.

Elements of Choreography and Improvisation

Dancers must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Dancers must be barefoot.

Encounter

Dancers must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Cover-ups are accepted. Dancers must be barefoot.

Fusion

Dancers must wear a leotard with either leggings, loose fitting pants, or fingertip length shorts. Hair should follow studio-wide policy. Dancers must be barefoot.

Hip-Hop (level 1)

Dancers must wear socks with sneakers, preferably that have little to no grip. Baggy street clothing, including sweatpants or fingertip length shorts is accepted. Hair should follow studio-wide policy.

Hip-Hop (levels 2, 3, 4)

Dancers must wear socks and low-top, white sneakers with laces. Sneakers must have little to no grip. Dancers must wear baggy street clothing, including sweatpants or fingertip length shorts. Hair should follow studio-wide policy.

<u>Jazz</u>

Dancers must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Dancers must be barefoot. Dance footwear for performances will be decided on later in the year.

<u>Lyrical</u>

Dancers must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Dancers must be barefoot.

<u>Modern</u>

Dancers must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Dancers must be barefoot.

Musical Theater

Dancers must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Dancers must be barefoot. Dance footwear for performances will be decided on later in the year.

Pointe

Dancers must wear a leotard, flesh-toned tights, and fitted, sewn pointe shoes. Hair should be secured into a bun.

Pre-Pointe

Dancers must wear a leotard, flesh-toned convertible tights, and flesh-toned ballet shoes. Hair should be secured into a bun.

<u>Tap</u>

Dancers must follow studio-wide policy for dress code. Dancers must wear black tap shoes.

Technique, Strength, and Length

Dancers must follow the studio-wide policy for dress code. Dancers must be barefoot.
